Opportunity to exhibit for current members of the Printmakers of Cape Cod

For this exhibition we are seeking works that highlight the artists' interpretation of the natural beauty of Cape Cod – the land, sea and skiescapes, as well as the world beneath the sea. Selection of artwork will be made based on how prints 'speak' to one another visually and thematically to create a viewer experience that encapsulates a sense of beauty. Both realistic and abstract works are appropriate.

We request that the artworks represent the artist's current work, have not been exhibited in the region, and have been produced within the last three years. Artists should include a short (50 word) artist statement. Members may enter up to 5 works for the selection process. Diptychs should be considered two pieces.

Entry: To apply for consideration, please send jpegs labeled with artist last name, artwork title, and dimensions in inches to jnemecc@highfieldhall.org Up to 5 pieces may be selected by an individual artist, so works created as a series will be considered.

Presentation: All works must be framed and ready to hang with eye hooks or D-rings. No hanging wires are required as Highfield installs the works from hanging rails with filament. Simple frames and white or cream mats are requested. Highfield has a history of robust art sales and artists receive 70% of the price of sold works. All artwork is fully insured while on the premises.

Beauty: Art in Dialogue with Nature will be hung in Highfield's first floor galleries. Anyone unfamiliar with the venue is welcome to schedule a visit at any time by contacting Jennifer Nemec, Assistant Director of Programs and Exhibitions at jnemec@highfieldhall.org.

The exhibition will receive increased exposure to regional curators and exhibition directors as it will be on display during the New England Museum Association annual conference which takes place in North Falmouth in October.

November 5 – 9 or by appointment: artwork pick up
